Cooking ~with~ Caroline

So I'm sticking to the pizza concept, yet approaching it from a different angle. A huge discussion in our generation's pop culture is pineapple on pizza. Ob-

viously, it does belong among the realm of pizza toppings, yet there are still huge discussions debating pineapple's validity on pizza. The question shouldn't be if pineapple belongs on pizza, but instead, what if pineapple was pizza? I hereby present: Christmas Pineapple Pizza.

Sidenote: Since I am trying to learn a little Spanish while I'm here from my handy dandy "Spanish Phrasebook & Dictionary," I will roughly translate some words, entirely mostly for my own enjoyment practice.

You will need:

- One fresh whole pineapple (*las anginas*)

STORIES FROM THE FIELD

MY EXPERIENCE AS A TRANSPORTATION PLANNING CO-OP STUDENT

This past summer, I had the opportunity to work for WSP, one of the world's leading professional services consulting firms, as a Transportation Planning Student. I worked within a small team of transportation engineers that had various years of experience. The Transportation Planning Department specifically offers planning and engineering services for a variety of transportation challenges, such as Environmental Assessments, regional and area transportation studies, site specific transportation assessments for residential, commercial and institutional developments, bicycle and pe-

destrian planning, transit planning, parking studies, traffic signing, and transportation demand management. All modes of transportation are modelled, including pedestrians, vehicles, transit, and freight, in order to optimize operational and design solutions. Well-planned and efficient transport networks are the foundation of economic prosperity by bringing communities closer together and enhancing the quality of life [1].

Overall, my duties mainly consisted of working on a variety of small projects. I participated in day-to-day project activities, assisted with the preparation of traffic engineering and planning studies, carried out traffic analysis and multi-modal LOS analysis, coordinated with project team members, and provided support to the department with other duties assigned. I worked on numerous projects in collaboration with my co-workers for a variety of respected federal, provincial, and municipal clients. The projects that I worked




on involved Transportation Master Plans, Active Transportation Plans, Traffic Impact Studies, Parking Studies, Active Transportation Functional Design, Transit Plans, Multi-Modal Studies, and traffic analysis related to construction staging in support of other internal departments. My job mainly consisted of office work, but I had the opportunity to go out in the field from time to time to attend meetings, conduct observations and studies, collect information, and set up traffic cameras.

The most challenging part of transportation planning from what I have gathered is the social science aspect of it. You have to anticipate human behavior, specifically roadway uses, population trends, future building developments, and other factors that dictate the design process. In addition, when projecting future traffic volumes, it requires good engineering judgement in interpretation of the empirical data available, and seeing how those differences in volumes will impact the conditions of an existing road network.
