

AT WHICH TIME I ATTEMPT TO EXPLAIN MY MADNESS

Oh, come on, you all knew it was coming. Someday or other, the article about metal was going to appear on the second page of this newspaper... and it was only because I was waiting for this exact theme that I held out.

This lyric from the black metal forefathers, Venom (possibly you may have even heard of them?!) in their song "Black Metal" could not have been any more fitting for an article about... black metal.

Well, and other metal, too. And why (I believe) it's such a core part of my identity.

I'll begin with the book that I am currently finishing up, entitled "Black Metal: The Cult Never Dies, Volume 1" by Dayal Patterson. It was written to shed light on the origin and progression of the black metal scene circa the early 90s, especially in Sweden, Norway, and (more surprisingly) Poland.

I had never expected to discover so much about myself by reading it, especially considering that it is, by no means, a self-help book.

But many of the interviews conducted and transcribed within really resonated with me. The sentiments of some black metal (or related subgenre) artists captured a view of their own lives and feelings that is eerily similar to my own. Reflecting on it later, this is not overly surprising, considering that I was drawn to black metal (actually, let's use the term "extreme metal" as it covers a broader range of subgenres) just as they were-similar people tend to flock to the same type of music. Edvard Rødseth of the band Strid had it exactly right, I think, when he said of his former bandmate's suicide: "Espen wasn't really depressed, I would say... he just didn't belong here, in a way. He was a misfit, and he felt like a misfit—we felt like misfits."



This sounds really dark, depressive, and decidedly angsty. But those exact emotions are what fuel this type of music and attract fans of the variety that "just don't belong" wherever they may try to fit. And I'd argue that this is beyond teenage angst, rather deeply rooted in one's sense of self.

It's affirming to read that my genre of choice was literally founded on the artists' insatiable desire to be different from everyone else, as it's a very relatable struggle for me as a listener.

I do wonder, however, if this "need" is actually driven by a desire to be non-conformists, or if it is simply just a different requirement for happiness.

I am introspective, which seems to be a one-way pipeline to being considered one of such "depressive," nonconforming individuals—the usual suspects when it comes to metalheads.

The problem is that people tend to equate the terms "depressive" and "unhappy." As if it is an oxymoron (and thus, impossible) to be a happy depressive individual. Well, I've demonstrated the capability for happiness plenty of times and I'm sure I will continue to experience happiness in the future. I just tend to seek happiness through less conventional means. Contrary to popular belief, I actually don't choose my interests based on their anti-mainstream quotient. Wow, crazy, I know. sentative of a culture that shares my vision of happiness. 

IT'S OVERSATURATION OF THE ARTS, I THINK, THAT'S THE PROBLEM ...



CFES stands for the Canadian Federation of Engineering Students, which is an organization that represents undergraduate engineering students to governing bodies such as Engineers Canada and the Canadian Engineering Accrediation Board for the betterment of Canadian engineering education.

An extremely pertinent undertak-

ing at this particular Congress was the passing of a motion mandating CFES to take a stance on the academic workload of engineering students.
