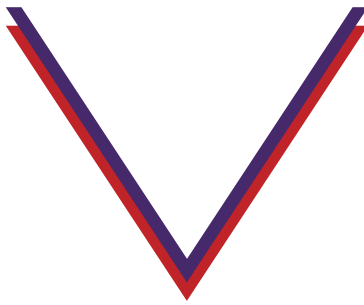

As a third year I survived University in person and online, so I thought I could help all the newcomers making their transition to in person being as seamless as possible.

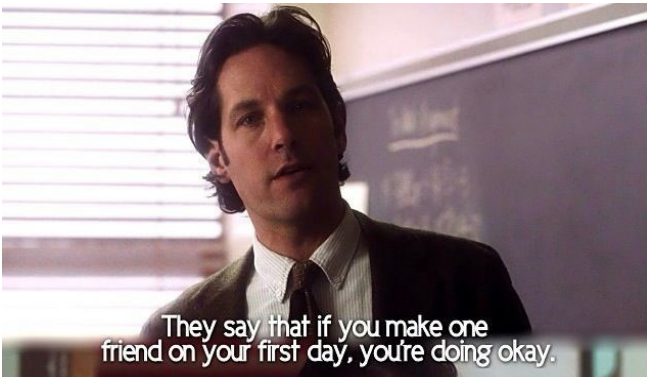
Trust me when I say everyone.

Do school assignments right after you go to that particular class.

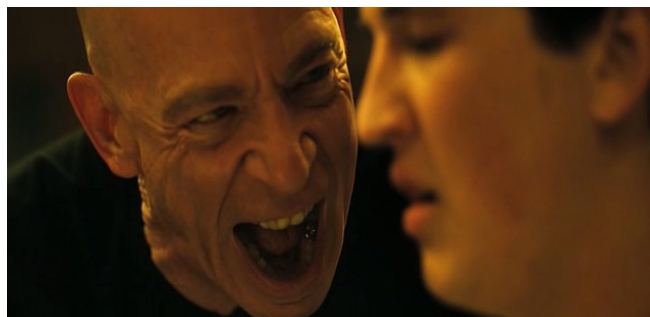

Carleton profs can be scary.



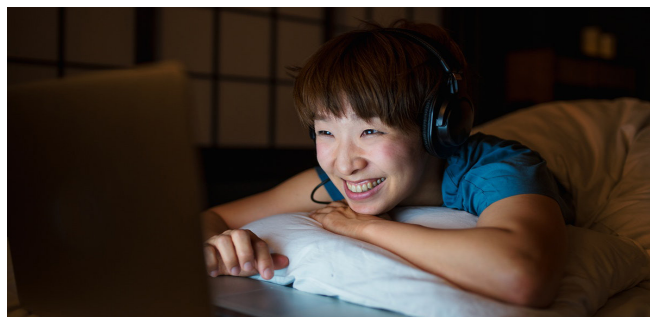

We build large scale bridges over a meter long solely out of popsicle sticks, white glue, and dental floss. Then we get to present them to a panel of judges and test how much load they can withstand before failure.

It's a fun way to get involved and put your practical engineering to the test! To participate you must be an undergraduate engineering student, you must be 18+ as of March 2021, you must complete the general interest form, and you must attend the small bridge competition held in mid October.

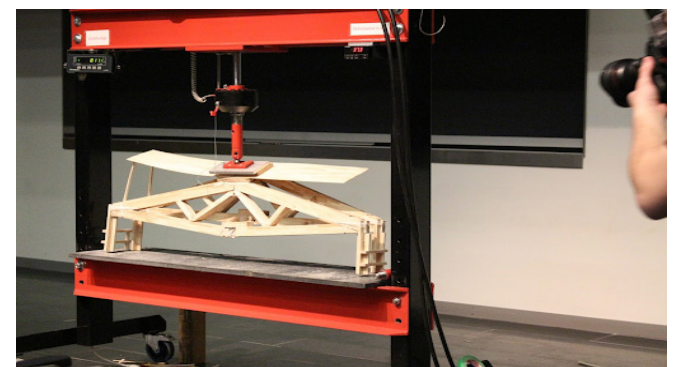

Akira - Sci-fi anime

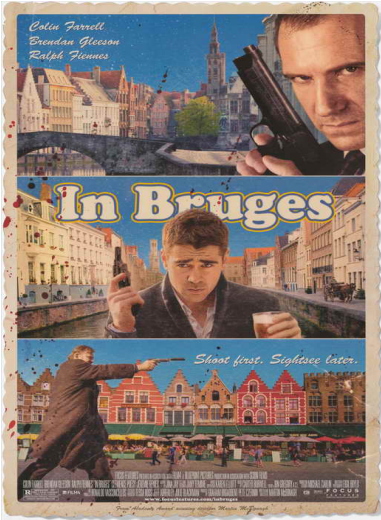

Engineering Bean Stew - 9.5/10 - Paprika isn't in sig figs

Hello! Today we will be making a bunch of bean stew, engineering style. This means that I'm going to give you really vague instructions but I swear it will make some bomb stew in the end so stay put. This stew can be made vegan, just don't put any of the meat in it. It still tastes awesome, I just think that the meat adds a little extra something, you know?



Ingredients:

- White kidney beans (put as many as you want I guess, but I usually go with 1 to 3/2 cups)
- Olive Oil
- Water
- 1 onion, diced
- 1-2 Big Carrots, diced
- 1 Green Bell Pepper, diced
- 1-2 Tomatoes, diced
- 1 cup Kielbasa, diced (optional) (I usually get the turkey kind)
- A crap ton of paprika
- 1/2-1 tbsp dried mint
- 1 tbsp Summer Savory
- Salt to taste
- Vinegar to taste

Instructions:

First you're going to want to look at your beans. Are they in a can? If so, you can proceed to step two. If you're like me and you buy dry beans in a bag however, you're going to need to soak your beans overnight. They might be crunchy if you just cook them right away.

After your beans have been soaked (pls drain the liquid), get a big soup pot. Set the stove to medium-high, and put your beans in the pot with around 3 cups of water. Once the water boils, lower the heat to medium-low and drain your beans. Then add some olive oil to the pot along with your beans. Cook the beans like this for a minute, making sure to move them around so they don't burn or any-

thing. I don't know how to tell if it's done or not, I guess once they look kinda shiny they're alright.

Fill that same pot up with 4 cups of water, and keep the heat medium-high, allowing for the water to slowly boil. While the water is boiling, cut up your veggies and meat if you haven't already. Place a pan on your stove with some more olive oil in it, and cook the onion, pepper, and carrot until soft. Add in your tomatoes, along with a bit of water, to allow for some steam to form. Add your kielbasa, paprika, mint, summer savory, and salt to the mix. Cook this mixture in the pan until it starts to smell really good.

Dump the pan mixture into the beans (which are hopefully boiling now), and maybe add some more paprika because you can never have too much. Lower the heat to a simmer, and cover the pot. Let this cook for 30-40 minutes, checking on it once in a while. If you notice that it might need more liquid, don't be afraid to just add a bit more water and keep it cookin'. That's it, that's the beans.

When you serve it, put a little bit of vinegar into your stew, I find that it brings it all together. But like really little, don't make your stew super acidic, you weirdo.

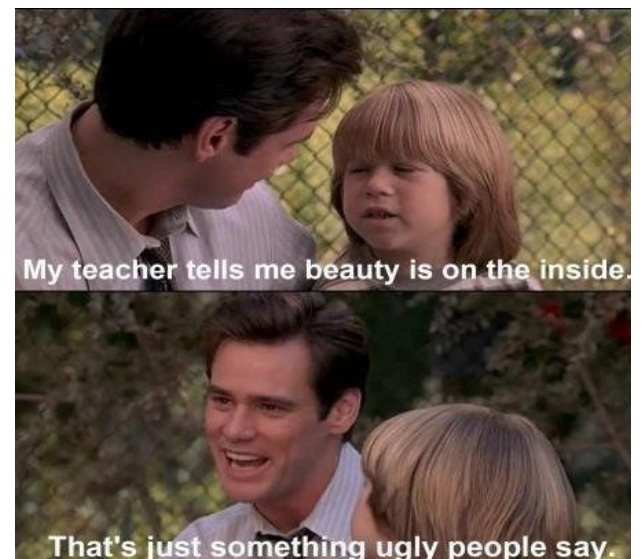
Hey Ceng!
